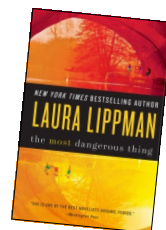
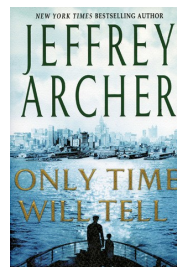

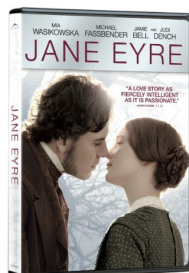

Audiobook and Ebook Changes Coming Soon

The State Library of Kansas website for downloading free audio and ebooks will be changing soon. The new service "Kansas EZ Library" will be found at <http://www.kslib.info/digitalbooks>. Downloadable audiobooks will be available from this page beginning in November, and downloadable ebooks beginning in January 2012.



Why is this change happening? The fee for the current company was scheduled to increase by 700% over the next 3 years. The library community would not be able to continue purchasing enough new books to keep up with demand, so the State Library changed companies.

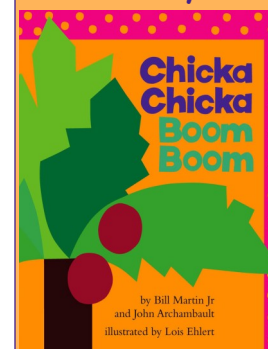
What happens to my current holds and wish list items when the site changes? Unfortunately, your holds and wish lists will not transfer. However, many of the books on the current site will remain available for checkout. You will need to search for the title again and replace your holds.

When will new content be added? Books will be added on an ongoing basis by libraries across the state.

Who can access these downloadable books? Any Kansas resident can checkout from this collection. Individuals will need a Kansas Library Card which can be obtained from any library in the state.

What devices will be compatible with the new service? All current devices which have been in use should work with the new services.
